Thursday, December 14, 2023 – Meeting Minutes

### **Approval of Minutes:**

William Gettman made a motion to approve the board minutes from the September 21, 2023 meeting. It was seconded by Graig Carbino. All approved, none opposed; motion carried.

#### **State of the Workforce Presentation**

Therese Daly, Interim Executive Director of the New York Association of Employment & Training Professionals (NYATEP) presented on the 2022 State of the Workforce and some preliminary findings for the upcoming release of the 2023 State of the Workforce Report. The 2022 State of the Workforce Report can be found at <a href="https://www.nyatep.org">www.nyatep.org</a>. Ms. Daly stated that preliminary data for the upcoming new report shows little change in NYS business needs and workforce demographics of NYers, with the exception of emerging workers coming from immigration. Mr. Glasgow and Ms. Del Paral spoke about the hybrid work environments and asked for additional clarifying data. Mr. Gettman asked for additional information around workforce development investments in human service workers and suggested that this data could also help advocacy organizations doing this same work in that sector. Ms. Daly offered to assist and perhaps share common advocacy messaging. Mr. Williams stated that he will make the connection between Mr. Gettman and Ms. Daly and share the full report to all the Board Members for similar endeavors. Ms. Daly also presented the legislative agenda items for the upcoming NYS Legislative session, with a focus on engaging additional workers into the labor force by expanding a sixmonth income disregard for individuals on public assistance, youth apprenticeship program expansion, continued investment for the NYS Office of Strategic Workforce Development, and additional opportunities for international credential recognition for immigrants

#### Youth & Emerging Worker Committee Update:

Presented by Michael Markou, Committee Chair

Mr. Markou reported that the Committee recently focused on the "Emerging Worker" potion of our charge to the workforce development. At the last Committee meeting, Dahlia Herring from the Refugee Roundtable provided an overall landscape vision of immigrants and refugees in the Capital Region along with the organizations that are serving these populations. Ms. Herring spoke of the numbers of immigrants, refugees, temporary legal status persons, asylum-seekers in the Capital Region as well as their needs of housing, language classes, transportation, and childcare. Spanish is the top language spoken by these individuals, but dozens of other languages are represented in the region. Mr. Markou stated that the need for organizations that provide services and need resources for staff to be able to connect to training and employment opportunities was found to be the greatest. The Committee will continue to work through making the connections to these emerging workers. The Committee will also be focusing on coordinating a "listening tour" to speak with youth and young adults on their needs, what they define as success, and how our workforce system can work directly with the individuals we will be serving in building programs.

#### **Policy & Oversight Committee Update:**

Presented by Deanna Simon, Committee Chair

Ms. Simon noted that the Committee is working through all of the required USDOL WIOA Board Policies for Career Centers and the workforce system. Ms. Simon thanked the Board Members for the past approval on several new policies and policy updates. It is the Committee's charge to have all required policies updated every few years to be compliant with USDOL regulations. Today, Ms. Simon brought to the Board an updated Initial Assessment Policy. This is a required policy that all staff in the Career Centers will follow for every new job seeking customer who comes to a career center. The purpose of an initial assessment of a job seeking customer is to analyze their needs and provide appropriate service or referral for the customer to successfully attain and retain quality employment. Ms. Simon noted that the current policy meets the general needs, but the language the Committee has added to this new policy will provide further clarity for staff and the ability to provide a more comprehensive service delivery to customers. Language added is a best-practice from other local areas and NYSDOL. Ms. Simon is presenting the revised Initial Assessment Policy on behalf of the Committee and making the motion for the full Board to approve the policy. Motion was seconded by Claudia Butler. All approved, none opposed; motion carried.
